

# RADNOR DAY CAMP FAQ

## What is Radnor Day Camp (RDC)?

- RDC is a 6-week summer camp for children and teens entering grades 1-9 (as of September 2021), utilizing indoor and outdoor facilities with focus on outdoor recreation.
- Inclusive camp setting comprised of structured activities with an array of benefits impacting physical, emotional, and social well-being, including arts & crafts, sports & games, performing arts, special guests, water games, critical thinking, problem solving, and more! Led by esteemed, professional staff from the Radnor community.

## When and where will RDC'21 occur?

- **Dates:** Monday-Friday, June 28th to August 6th, 2021 (no camp 7/5)
- **Time:** Full Day (9:00 AM-3:00 PM) or Half Day (9:00 AM-12:30 PM)
- **Location:** Radnor Activity Center (125 South Wayne Avenue, Wayne PA, 19087)

⇒ Camp will take place primarily outside with access to the Radnor Activity Center at Sulpizio Gym for additional activities as well as shelter in the event of inclement weather. Radnor Middle School, Radnor Elementary School, or other locations may be used as secondary locations.

## What are the health & safety procedures for RDC'21?

- RDC will operate to the fullest of our capabilities in accordance with the guidelines that have been put forth by the federal, state, and local agencies including the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention), and the PA Governor/Department of Health regarding COVID-19.
- Required documents including the [2021 Radnor Day Camp Operating Health and Safety Procedures](#) are very specific to how we will operate and must be signed and accepted before your camper can participate.

## What are the Registration Fees for RDC'21?

- **Registration Fees:** Full Day: \$1,200 / Half Day: \$935 / RTSD Extended School Year (ESY) Participants: \$1,030 (Non-Radnor Residents add \$30.00 for Non-Resident Fee)
- **Multi-Sibling Discount:** Register 3 or more children in your immediate family and receive a discount of \$25.00 per child.
- **Potential Optional Add-ons:** Additional services/activities may be available after May 1st for a potential price adjustment to the registration fee. These may include excursions (i.e. Valley Forge Park and/or a local outdoor swimming pool), and/or weekly individual boxed lunches.

## When, where & how do I drop off/pick up my camper(s)?

- Daily camper drop off/pick up will occur on a staggered schedule by camper group that will be structured within a specific time frame that will be provided prior to the start of camp.
- We ask that families do not arrive at camp outside of this designated time frame.
- Any unexpected weekly changes to a camper's arrival or departure time needs to be communicated by the parent/guardian via written notice to the RDC Director(s).
- Parents/guardians/individuals who are authorized to pick up your campers must present a photo ID to RDC Staff at pick-up
- More details regarding the drop off/pick up process including specific ingress/egress areas and locations will be provided prior to the start of camp.

## What happens in the event of inclement weather/excessive heat?

- On days of inclement weather such as heavy rain or excessive heat, RDC will take place inside the Radnor Activity Center with a modified schedule.
- During all times of usage within the building, constant efforts will be made to social distance of 6' or more. (Registration will be regulated based on the current capacity regulations for indoor use. While inside, staff will keep the campers separated within the space, but within their groups.)



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## What types of activities will my camper(s) participate in at RDC?

- RDC will operate on a structured daily schedule taking place, in majority, outdoors and with low/no contact activities. These activities will include: individually packaged arts and crafts, sports and games, team building exercises, creative and performing arts, weekly group-based special event traditions such as Camp Olympics, Camp Carnival, and many others!
- Campers and their corresponding staff members will be 'cohorted', that is, placed into small groups, based on their September 2021 grade, and will stay together within that camp group each day and for the entire duration of camp. Camper groups may consist of participants from multiple grades depending on registration. The size of each group will not exceed more than 25 including all group staff members and special needs support staff members. Groups will maintain a staff member to camper ratio of 1:10 – this number may be slightly lower for younger campers and slightly higher for older campers. The number of groups will be determined through the final registration process for campers and will be regulated based on the current capacity regulations for indoor use as applied to the Radnor Activity Center.

## What should my camper wear to camp each day?

- Campers should bring their own face mask each day. Their face mask must be comfortably-fitting and fit over the entire mouth and nose. *\*Gaiters, balaclavas, scarfs and bandanas are not permitted.*
- Campers should wear appropriate camp clothes that consist of athletic apparel, including sneakers or rubber soled shoes should be worn every day. Sandals, flip-flops, Crocs, "Heeleys" (shoes with a wheel in the heel) and bare feet are not acceptable. We will schedule days for water-play activities and campers will be permitted to wear a swimsuit to camp.
- We recommend that parents/guardians also apply sunscreen to their camper before coming to camp. For campers that are unable to reapply sunscreen at camp, the spray or dot method will be used – spray bottles supplied by parents will be sprayed on the campers and they will be responsible for rubbing it in; liquid bottles supplied by parents will be 'dotted' onto the camper by the staff members and the camper will be responsible for rubbing it in.

## How will communications take place between parents/campers & RDC?

- The Recreation & Community Programming Department will continue to serve as the main contact on behalf of the program for all questions related to registration and operating policies and procedures.
- Parents/Guardians will be provided with the contact cellular number of the Camp Director(s) in addition to a list of contact information for the Recreation Department Staff.
- Campers will receive information and listen to announcements each day within their established group. We will send out any weekly updates or communications by email and they will be published on the Radnor Day Camp website, [www.radnor.com/RDC](http://www.radnor.com/RDC).

## How will camper behavior be handled this year?

- Camper behavior will be held in accordance with the established Camper Code of Conduct that is in place for the camp. This information will be provided in the Welcome Packet that all registered families will receive prior to the start of camp.

## What should campers bring to RDC each day?

- Campers must bring a drawstring bag/backpack to camp each day.
- The following items should all fit within the the camper's bag and should include: a swim towel (for sitting in the grass/to assist with defining social distancing during various activities), sunscreen, hand sanitizer, face mask, pack of tissues, Ziploc bag, snacks, and if applicable the camper's EpiPens and/or inhaler.
- Water, Lunch & Snacks - Drinking fountains will be restricted at camp; Campers will be required to provide their own water each day. We highly recommend that you send your camper with one or more bottles of water or a large, insulated water bottle.
- Please ensure that your camper can manage all snacks/lunch themselves. Staff members will take extra precautions managing/handling food for their campers; however, we understand that younger campers, or campers with special needs, may require additional assistance.
- Campers will be asked to wash their hands before they eat and several times throughout the day.
- All personal items should be clearly labeled with your camper's first and last name.

## How are special camper circumstances, requirements, and life-threatening/non-life-threatening conditions handled at RDC?

- If your child has special circumstances or requirements, please contact the Radnor Township Recreation Department as soon as possible to ensure that accommodations can be made as necessary, and as possible by our Department. RDC welcomes all campers to participate; however, due to limitations on staffing, facilities, and other conditions, may not be able to safely meet the individual's needs.
