How do I call for police service?

In Radnor Township, all calls for services are obtained by dialing 9-1-1. The Delaware County Emergency Services System, takes all calls from Radnor Township and routes them to the appropriate agency for dispatch. So whether it is an alarm call, accident or barking dog call these all need to go through 9-1-1 so they can be dispatched to patrol officers.

What if I need a copy of an accident or an incident report?

For this administrative function of the police department you can call 610.688.0503 which is a non-emergency phone line Monday thru Friday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m..

Emergency Alert System

Radnor Township has an alert system to keep residents aware of issues within the Township. It is a free service for e-mail and text alerts. You can register online at www.radnor.com. There are seven categories for alerts you can choose one or all.

Open Container Law

No person shall have, possess, carry or transport any alcoholic beverage in an open container in or upon any public place or private property or in any vehicle upon

Peddling & Soliciting

It shall be unlawful for any person, to engage in selling or soliciting the sale or purchase, by use of any sample or otherwise, of food, printed matter, services, goods, wares or merchandise of any description or to engage in soliciting without a valid Township issued permit. Political and non-profit groups are exempt from this requirement. SAFETY TIPS

If You're Traveling:

- Set an automatic timer for your lights
- Ask a trusted neighbor to watch your home, shovel the walks, pick up newspapers and mail, and park in the driveway from time to time.
- Be sure to hide any gifts that may be left in your home while you're gone.

If You're Out for the Evening:

- Turn on lights and a radio or TV so it appears that someone is home.
- Lock all doors and windows, even if you'll be gone for just a few minutes.
- Do not place packages or gifts near windows or other high-visibility sites.

If You're Shopping:

- Don't let your guard down just because you are rushing.
- Stay alert and be aware of everything around you at all times.
- Park in well-lit areas as close to the store as possible, lock your car doors, and hide packages in the trunk or under seats.
- Do not carry large amounts of cash; pay with a check or credit card.
- Take only 1 credit card with you shopping.
- Make sure you do not carry all your packages at the same time.
- Carry your purse close to your body, not dangling by the straps. Put your wallet in an inside coat or front pants pocket.
- Teach your children to go to a police officer or store security guard if they get separated or lost.

If a Stranger Comes to the Door:

- Stay alert to suspicious looking couriers delivering packages to you or your neighbors.
- Many con artists try to take advantage of holiday generosity by going door-to-door. Ask for identification and get specifics as to how and where the donations will be used.
- If you feel uncomfortable, just say "No, thank you," and shut the door.
